WASHINGTON, D.C. ---In 1979, the average black man in America earned about 80 percent of the hourly wage of the average white man (\$15 versus \$19 per hour). By 2016, this gap had grown such that the average black male worker earned just 70 percent of the hourly wage of the average white male worker, according to the Current Population Survey and Bureau of Labor Statistics. Factors such as age, education, occupation, and location figure prominently in some income disparities. Studies also show that institutions, historical pay norms, discrimination and the effects of public policies such as the minimum wage also affect the pay gap.
